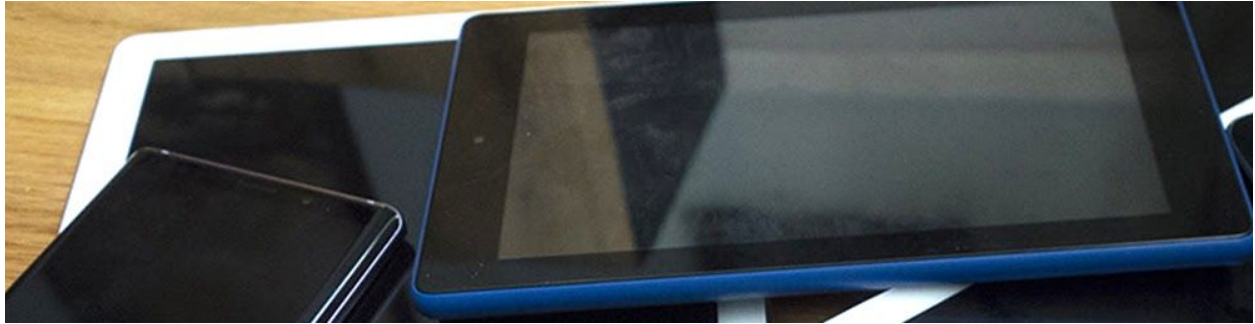


Gardner Homeschool



We were struggling with device take-over. Our kids were obsessed with YouTube, Minecraft, and Fortnite, we couldn't get them to do anything constructive with their devices.

Then we discovered Arcademics. Arcademics has been a good way to engage our kids. I assign games to them and they log on and play with each other, their friends that are online, and cousins. We set up Private games, then see which friends or cousins are online, and send them the password to join. It gets pretty rowdy when a game is going on. Sometimes we'll have a video chat going on the side, to encourage the players and discuss prize ideas for the winners.

I like being able to track their scores while they are playing and view data on what they're getting right and wrong - so I have a good idea of what we need more work on.

Our favorite game to play is Tug Team Tractors. We start a Private game, choose sides based on age and ability, and start the game. The winning side gets to choose the family night movie and dessert. There's a lot of positive encouragement between the kids.

The kids now ask us to play Arcademics! We've seen a jump in their math facts, and it helps us set the weekly work plan from the game scores.

This is a great way to take advantage of the capabilities of our kids' devices, and use them in an educational way.
